A GUIDE FOR TODAY'S SERVICE

Today's Sermon: Mark moves quickly in his gospel to explain Christ's kingdom, and, in the handful of verses of today's text, he shows that this kingdom is the same kingdom that is spoken of in the Old Testament and is entered by repentance and faith—the same gospel preached in the Old Testament. He also gives us a quick introduction to our Lord's means of expanding the kingdom (disciples who will become fishers of men), and he introduces us to the authority of King Jesus found in Christ's teaching and His working of miracles.

Mark moves so fast it feels like someone hit the fast forward button. He does by this method give us a wonderfully crisp and clear grasp of who Jesus is and what He did. And even though it may feel like you need to hang on to something because of the speed of Mark's movement, it will become clear as we work through this gospel that Mark was determined that we should not leave his gospel without being overwhelmed with the life and ministry of Jesus Christ.

I Love to Tell the Story was written by Kate Hankey who was not born into the kind of family that typically rears songwriters and missionaries. Kate was born in 1834 and grew up in a fashionable London suburb as the daughter of a wealthy British banker. However, Kate had a passion for the gospel that sent her into the world to share the Good News. Kate was involved in Bible studies for neighborhood and factory girls and had a prison ministry—not the type of work that others expected of her. She wrote this hymn along with "Tell me the Old, Old Story" during a time of sickness when she was unable to teach. She continued to tell the story until old age required her to stop. This hymn is today sung as a response to the Psalm 66:16 where the Psalmist declares that it was his desire to tell what God has done for his soul (v. 16).

I Love Thy Kingdom, Lord: Written by the famous Timothy Dwight—theologian, poet, grandson of Jonathan Edwards, for many years president of Yale—this is thought to be the oldest hymn still in common use written by an American. Its theme, the kingdom of God, fits well with Jesus' call to His kingdom through the preaching of repentance and faith.
